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1. Setting of the testing and target group

This report represents the 2nd Internal Evaluation for the international Erasmus+ - project EDU-VET (E-Learning, Digitisation and Units for Learning at VET schools – Creating online Learning Environments in Technical Education for European metal industry).

The Internal Evaluation was conducted from the 16th to 31st of December 2020 with the online tool Lime Survey. The survey was divided into eight question parts which includes 15 questions in total. The survey persisted of open and closed questions. The eight participants were from Germany, UK, Spain and the Netherlands.

Question 7.2:

Concerning to the project time-frame the deliverables were prepared in a timely-manner. This will be confirmed completely by 16.67 % and in most cases by 66.67 % of the participants (see table 8; figure 8). This means that the Corona pandemic has no significant effect on the preparation of the deliverables of the Intellectual Outputs in this project. But one person points out the very difficult cooperation with companies that has prevailed since the Corona pandemic, so that the quality of the documents is indirectly affected. These aspect will be already mentioned in the following question.

Question 10:

The results in table11 give a closer look to which IOs have a high standard. These IOs and deliverables are evaluated as (very) good in average. There exists not a single IO that was evaluated badly so far. The IO1 (50.00% = great- very good quality), IO2 (66.67% = great- very good quality), IO3 (33.33% = great- very good quality) and IO5 (33.33% = great- very good quality) were rated best. This is probably due to the fact that these IOs are all very well developed or that they are in a productive process of creation at the moment. IO4 and IO6 are currently still in preparation.

Question 11:

Question 11 asks for the relevance of IO5. The results show that the partners think that it is very helpful for the learners to search for best practices. Therefore, the combination of theory and practical examples leads to a high learning success. Nevertheless, the Corona pandemic makes it difficult to acquire companies, as it is difficult to establish contact with companies.

Question 12:

The results of question 12 give a more detailed insight into what the partners are satisfied with, especially in IO2 and IO3. It shows that the partners evaluate IO2 and IO3 in overall terms as being of very good quality, even on average (see table 13). This can be seen in the module structure (40.00% = high quality), module content (60.00% = very good quality), module design and layout (75.00% = good quality), learning outcomes (75.00% = very good quality) and H5P-tasks (60.00% = very good quality).

Question 14.1:

The partners agreed that the pandemic has an effect on conducting project activities. Especially the field-based research (interviews, questionnaire survey) was strongly influenced by the Corona pandemic, as personal contacts were cancelled and all research activities had to be conducted online. This will be also highlichted by the statement *"Most of our collaborators cancelled their activity or*

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reduced it drastically. They were very busy with their own circumstances and they couldn't pay attention to our requests."

3. Summary

The results of the 2nd Internal Evaluation shows clearly that the project process of EDU-VET proceeded successful as positive for all project partners. The partners show a high satisfaction with the collaboration among the EDU-VET project. Nevertheless, all partners express concerns regarding the Corona crisis. It is emphasised that project work has been made more difficult since the pandemic. This is evident, for example, in field-based research or in cooperation with companies or in the project team. At present, these activities can only be carried out online. Despite all the circumstances, the partners are confident and are doing their best, so that the project can be completed successfully.

The development process of IO1, IO2, IO3, IO4 and IO5 are currently running. IO1 (Summary Research Report)will be finished until end of January 2021. Additionally, IO2 and IO3 are in the middle of the processing phase. IO4 will be launched at the end of 2020. At the moment, the framework concept is being revised in relation to the handbook creation, so that all partners can start writing the chapters of the handbook latest at the beginning of February 2021. Concerning IO5, the acquisition of the best

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practices is very difficult because of the reduction of personal contact due to the pandemic. As the IO5 is still running until the end of this year 2021, this IO5 is not time-critical. IO6 has not yet started. The partners of EDU-VET are sure, that the project results match and serve the needs of the target group.

Particularly, a regular exchange is very important to all partners. The collaboration and exchange take place in small groups and/or in the whole project team. Due to the Corona pandemic and the elimination of face-to-face meetings, regular meetings are more important than ever. The meetings take place online via Skype or Zoom.

Besides, the project partners are satisfied with their dissemination activities. In this context, they prefer following dissemination channels:

- Social Media (Facebook, ...)
- Internet-based activities (Project website,...)
- Paper-based activities (Posters, flyer,...)
- Project performance-based activities (Project website, contact to ministries and governmental institutions...)

In summary, all partners look forward to the project issues. The team is confident that the project can be successfully completed despite the corona crisis.
